I observed the vehicle stationary facing southbound in the southbound lane on Mervell Dean Road at Beck Road. I observed damage to the front of the vehicle. I contacted the driver of the Jeep, Wesley Price Goldston (W/M DOB 05/21/1977) in the rear of Ambulance 799. Mr. Goldston was being checked out by EMS personnel and he advised me he was okay. I was able to locate two witnesses at the scene, Elizabeth Ann Quade (W/F DOB 06/03/1969) and Charles Smith Eddleman (W/M DOB 01/30/1949). We notified Thomas Frederick Gray (W/M DOB 05/31/1934) at 2144 hours of the death of Mr. Baird. The deceased lived in an RV camper in the front yard of Mr. Gray's residence. Mr. Gray was the only known next of kin. Mr. Gray advised the deceased lived on his property for approximately six years and he did not know of any relatives for the deceased. I contacted the driver of the Jeep, Wesley Price Goldston (W/M DOB 05/21/1977) in the rear of Ambulance 799. Mr. Goldston was being checked out by EMS personnel and he advised me he was okay.

I was able to locate two witnesses at the scene, Elizabeth Ann Quade (W/F DOB 06/03/1969) and Charles Smith Eddleman (W/M DOB 01/30/1949). I provided Ms. Quade and Mr. Eddleman with an MSP form 76 Driver/Witness Statement and gathered contact information from both of them. They both provided statements advising the events that took place before, during and after the accident. Mr. Goldston also provided a written statement utilizing an MSP form 76 Driver/Witness Statement.

Several Fire and EMS personnel on the scene were able to provide me with the name of the pedestrian, due to them having numerous past encounters with the subject. After I spoke with the witnesses and identified the pedestrian, I assisted with scene control and traffic control by hanging up crime scene tape and placing multiple flares in the roadway north of the accident scene. I directed traffic and awaited the arrival of the MSP CRASH Team. After the arrival of the CRASH Team, Lt. Thompson # 3217 and I responded to 24350 Old Hollywood Road, Hollywood, Maryland. We notified Thomas Frederick Gray (W/M DOB 05/31/1934) at 2144 hours of the death of Mr. Baird. The deceased lived in an RV camper in the front yard of Mr. Gray's residence. Mr. Gray was the only known next of kin. Mr. Gray advised the deceased lived on his property for approximately six years and he did not know of any relatives for the deceased.

On 5/02/2011, I received two envelopes of information forwarded to me from the Saint Mary's State's Attorney's Office and left at the Maryland State Police Glen Burnie Barrack by Corporal Logsden. The first was a response to the subpoena sent to the Hollywood Volunteer Rescue Squad for the reports they had pertaining to the collision. They provided copies of the Electronic Maryland Ambulance Information System Patient Care Reports for both Wesley Goldston and Buhrman Baird, the driver and pedestrian, respectively, involved in the collision.

Goldston's report was number 1736705, incident number 672. Ambulance 797 was the responding unit. They incorrectly reported his last name as "Goldstrome". They received the call on 1/19/2011 at 1900 hours and arrived to Goldston at 1904 hours. Christopher Miller was the provider in charge of care. Dennis Woodburn was the driver of the ambulance. Barbara Wible and Richard Battenfield were both listed as providers. Goldston refused medical care and there were no remarkable entries on the report. Ambulance 797 was listed as the first unit on the scene, with the following other units present at the scene: "CO.7, MSP, SMSO, Amb.799, Ch.7, CH.79". They were placed back in service at 1926 hours.

Baird's report was number 1736827, incident number 672. Ambulance 799 was the responding unit. They incorrectly reported his name as "Jim Haird". They received the call on 1/19/2011 at 1900 hours and arrived to Baird at 1903 hours. Baird was deceased prior to their arrival, with no vital signs listed. Kyle Woodburn was listed as the provider in charge of care. Daniel Coleman was the driver of the ambulance. John Miedzinski and Arjuna Dharmaraja were both listed as providers. They were placed back in service at 1940 hours. The other units listed as being present at the scene were amb 797, sqd 7, Ch 7, and Ch 79. In the narrative portion, they described being dispatched for a motor vehicle collision with a pedestrian being struck. When they arrived they found a male lying on the right side of the roadway unconscious. There was a state police vehicle present at the scene, which they later learned was the striking vehicle. The struck pedestrian, Baird, was not breathing and had no pulse. They wrote that Baird had been struck and drug for approximately 75 feet, with the vehicle continuing 20 feet past that. Baird had what was believed to be blood and spinal fluid exiting his ears and the back of his head. His legs were folded behind his back with degloving on both hands. There was a partial amputation of the right hand. Baird's dentures were found in a nearby driveway. Baird was covered with a sheet, and responding police officers then placed them back in service.

The next envelope of information was the court order to the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration for any and all records they had for Buhrman Baird and their response. The Motion for Appropriate Relief was filed in the Circuit Court of Saint Mary's County by Robyn Riddle on 4/14/2011. Judge Karen Abrams signed the order. The Motor Vehicle Administration provided the information from their Medical Advisory Board and Driver Wellness and Safety Division regarding an investigation they conducted.

There was a letter from Pace Pipe Line Company dated 4/23/1973 which stated that Baird worked there from October of 1970 until April of 1973 as a heavy duty mechanic and welder. He also operated several types of equipment, and the company considered him to be an asset to any company or firm in the construction field as a mechanic or operator.

There was a letter from attorney John F Slade III to the Operating Engineers Pension Trust Fund dated 6/3/1986. The letter stated that Baird was applying for retired employee benefits as requested. Baird had been initiated into Local no. 147B on 12/14/1941, and then transferred to Local no. 77 on 4/18/1948. Baird then withdrew in 1953 as he joined the United States Army and served in the Korean Conflict. After his military service, he re-entered Local no. 77 in 1958, remaining active until his retirement 2/1/1986.

There was a discharge paper from the Washington Hospital Center dated 3/10/1993. Doctor Michael Dennis was the attending physician and Doctor Thomas Chappel dictated. Baird had been admitted 12/29/1992 and discharged 2/4/1993. Baird sustained a closed head injury with an associated subarachnoid hemorrhage. He remained in a semi-comatose state in the intensive care unit for several days. An angiograph was used to rule out an aneurysm. Baird recovered to what he considered to be his baseline mental status, with assistance from physical, occupational and speech therapy. After being evaluated, Baird was found to be suitable for discharge to home, where he would receive minimal care and assistance. He was discharged with no medication on 2/4/1993. The discharge diagnosis was a closed head injury.

There was a letter dated 8/1/1993 from George Aud that stated Aud felt Baird was normal, and had been for the previous 40 years, and that Baird had not been in a collision or received any points against his driver's license.

There was an electroencephalography report from S Krishna Nandipati MD dated 12/30/1993. The report was for Baird, who was referred by Doctor V K Shah for a history of head trauma. The majority of the report focused on a description of the equipment and operation of it. The last paragraph stated that it was a minimally abnormal electroencephalogram because of temporal slowing. There was no seizure or spike activity during the recording.

There was a letter from the law office of Oliver Guyther addressed to the Maryland Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Administration dated 5/10/1994. Guyther wrote that he had been a practicing attorney in southern Maryland for 45 years and had known Baird for 35 years. Guyther wrote about Baird's speech impediment, which he thought could have been mistaken for a drinking problem to people not familiar with Baird. After Baird's eye injury, he was a successful heavy equipment operator. When Baird had been struck in his head on 12/28/1992, he incurred significant expenses while also suffering from a loss of earnings. Guyther described Baird as well and capable of operating equipment, trucks and automobiles.

He also wrote that Baird needed his license to earn his living and that he never had a drinking problem. Guyther volunteered to appear at any hearings or interviews to assist Baird in obtaining his driver's license again.

There was a letter from Walter Dorsey, the State's Attorney for Saint Mary's County, dated 5/18/1994. It was directed toward the Motor Vehicle Administration. Dorsey wrote that he had known Baird for over 40 years, first meeting him after a war while they were both members of the Maryland National Guard. He wrote that Baird had an excellent reputation in the community and did not abuse alcohol. He felt Baird had no change in his physical appearance or personality since his 1992 injury. Dorsey felt that if his vision did not impair his driving ability, that he would not present a danger to the driving public. Dorsey also felt that Baird would exercise more care and caution than many of the young drivers on the highways.

There was a neurological summary dated 6/10/1994 from S. K. Nandipati MD. In summary, Baird had received a closed head injury with subarachnoid hemorrhage on 12/29/1992. Baird was struck at the Saint Mary's Shopping Center in Lexington Park and then taken to Saint Mary's Hospital. Baird was transferred to Washington Hospital Center, where he remained for five weeks. He received physical, occupational and speech therapy there. He was discharged to his residence where he would receive minimal care and assistance. At that time he was stable and not medicated. Baird did not report any medical problems. He returned to the office 12/13/1993 for an electroencephalograph which did not reveal any evidence of spikes, except for minor swelling. Baird again denied any medical problems and was not medicated. Baird had previous surgical history for a cleft palate repair, which caused speech problems. Baird was described as alert and oriented, with normal speech.

There was a letter from Senator Roy Dyson dated 5/21/1996 to "IUOE Local 77". The letter was in reference to a situation Baird encountered in 1993. Baird had walked in to the IUOE office from the Washington Hospital Center. He arrived after the office closed and slept there. The next morning he requested assistance from the union in getting transportation back to his residence in Saint Mary's County. Baird even offered to pay for the transportation. The office then contacted the Prince George's County Police, who escorted Baird "back here", with no explanation of where he was escorted to. Baird was surprised by that response since he was a union member for a long time. Baird wanted to know why they had not done as he requested. Senator Dyson then requested a response be sent to Baird and himself.

There was a letter from Yogi Baird to an editor. The letter was signed as Buhrman Baird and had a post script note at the end that the latest discovered rock on Mars was named Yogi. The letter was dated 7/17/1996. It described a flag being raised by members of the Leonardtown National Guard Armory in the Leonardtown Square. Baird wrote that he was one of the men raising the flag and was seeking assistance in identifying the other two men and the date of occurrence. He wrote that Senator Roy Dyson was assisting him.

There was a letter from 9/17/1997 from Delegate John F Slade III addressed to Anne Ferro of the Motor Vehicle Administration. Delegate Slade wrote that Baird had contacted his office in reference to renewing his license. Baird's commercial driver's license expired 9/9/1997, and he attempted to renew it 9/10/1997. At that time, his commercial license was taken from him and he was issued a class C driver's

license.

There was a letter from Anne Ferro of the Motor Vehicle Administration replying to a letter sent to her from Delegate John F Slade III. The letter was dated 9/30/1997. She explained that Baird had not met the vision requirements for an unrestricted commercial driver's license. Since his license was expiring, Baird agreed to downgrade to a non-commercial license. Ferro explained that Baird was entitled to apply for a physical waiver, which if approved would allow Baird to operate commercial vehicles in Maryland only. Baird had been provided those documents and instructions by the licensing supervisor when he downgraded his license. She then wrote that Baird could contact Joyce Mallon if he needed information or assistance.

There was a Medical Advisory Board Review paper dated 7/25/2000. It was for medical reasons and listed Baird as suspended since 10/2000 by the Medical Advisory Board. A physician submitted information about a subarachnoid hemorrhage in 1993 and there was an 8/18/2000 request for reexamination. The second page also had a hand-written note about a subarachnoid hemorrhage from second degree trauma in 1992. The Medical Advisory Board recommended a physician's report be submitted and a decision held in abeyance until it was received. They also recommended a Functional Capacity Test. There was a note at the bottom of the page; however, I had received a poor copy which combined with the penmanship, made most of the note illegible.

There was a Request for Re-Examination of a Driver form completed 8/18/2000 by Deputy Clarlo #128 of the Saint Mary's County Sheriff's Office. It described a collision and improper lane change that occurred at Route 235 and Sandy Bottom Road. Physical defects listed for Baird were hearing aids, glasses, impaired left eye, impaired speech and the appearance of a stroke victim. The deputy wrote that those defects, combined with statements about Fidel Castro, the Korean War, and the cost to repair his vehicle, led him to believe a re-examination was necessary.

There was a Notice of Emergency Suspension dated 9/25/2000 to Baird. It stated that Baird's driving privilege was going to be suspended 10/02/2000 due to him being inimical to public safety. Included were instructions for how to request a hearing to dispute the suspension.

There was a Health Inquiry Cover Page dated 9/26/2000 which listed the forms Baird needed to have completed by 10/26/2000.

There was a Health Inquiry Cover Page dated 12/12/2001 to Baird which was informing him that the Motor Vehicle Administration Medical Advisory Board was investigating medical conditions that may affect his ability to operate a vehicle safely.

There was a completed physician's report, which was dated 12/18/2001, with the only abnormalities selected head trauma from January 1993 and visual impairment from World War 2. In the comments section for that, the physician wrote that Baird lost vision in his left eye during World War 2 and that he had a subarachnoid hemorrhage in 1993. He continued that Baird had no neurological difficulties and was evaluated by a neurologist June of 1994 with "essentially normal" results. In another section, he wrote that Baird's general examination was normal with the exception of a loss of vision in his left eye. He had a

history of a subarachnoid hemorrhage but was not medicated at that time. The results of his treatment were good, although there was no treatment mentioned. His prognosis was excellent. The physician listed no limitations. He wrote that Baird was reliable in taking medications and that Baird had been under his care for 15 years. In the physician's opinion, Baird was physically and mentally capable of safely operating a motor vehicle at that time. The physician's information was at the end of the form:

There was a political cartoon from the 12/25/2001 edition of the Saint Mary's Today newspaper. A handwritten note underneath stated that a state trooper gave him a seatbelt citation for his first offense of not wearing a seatbelt. He then described a social worker placing him in a private home in Loveville, with a bed mounted on cinder blocks. He had to walk into Leonardtown to get food to eat. The Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration had taken his driver's license three times. The author of the note felt that they were a slave because they had no rights or freedoms. They took all of their money out of their savings account to pay the bills. The last sentiment was that people from other countries get driver's licenses and "polite license" under false names and addresses.

There was a Medical Advisory Board Health Questionnaire completed by Baird 1/17/2002. Baird wrote that he was retired and disabled at that time. Both of his parents were deceased and he had no other family. There were no known medical problems with them. Baird wrote that he was not taking any medication, and that his physician was named Robert Bauer MD. Baird wrote that he had a temporary loss of vision and a serious eye injury in 1944. He had eye surgery in the late 1960's, as well as blindness then. He wrote that he wore eye glasses. He did not select any other medical problems or irregularities, including drug and alcohol abuse. He also wrote that he had never been arrested.

There was a letter dated 5/21/2002 to Baird, with the sender's information redacted. It said that the decision they came to may have been influenced by a consumer report from the Motor Vehicle Administration.

There was an Administrative Review and Decision form for medical reasons dated 7/25/2002. The decision was being held pending receipt of a Functional Capacity Test and a current physician's report. Baird was to be brought in for a Medical Advisory Board interview when that information was received.

There was a letter from the Motor Vehicle Administration dated 7/27/2002 to Baird. It was informing him that they were going to conduct a Functional Capacity Test to evaluate his ability to safely operate a motor vehicle. Baird needed to call to schedule an appointment and to furnish them with a completed physician's report.

There was a letter from the Motor Vehicle Administration from 9/12/2002 informing Baird that as

requested by him, they would schedule an interview with the Medical Advisory Board physician. They enclosed a form to be completed by Baird's treating physician and submitted during his interview. The completed physician's report was attached. The only abnormalities selected were head trauma from January 1993 and visual impairment from World War 2. In the comments section for that, the physician wrote that Baird lost vision in his left eye during World War 2 and that he had a subarachnoid hemorrhage in 1993. He continued that Baird had no neurological difficulties and was evaluated by a neurologist June of 1994 with "essentially normal" results. In another section, he wrote that Baird's general examination was normal with the exception of a loss of vision in his left eye. He had a history of a subarachnoid hemorrhage but was not medicated at that time. The results of his treatment were good, although there was no treatment mentioned. His prognosis was excellent. The physician listed no limitations. He wrote that Baird was reliable in taking medications and that Baird had been under his care for 16 years. In the physician's opinion, Baird was physically and mentally capable of safely operating a motor vehicle at that time. The physician's information was at the end of the form, which was dated 8/19/2002:

There was a letter from the Motor Vehicle Administration to Baird from 9/23/2002 that informed him of the scheduling of his Medical Advisory Board hearing to evaluate his ability to operate a vehicle safely. It was scheduled for 10/23/2002 at 1330 hours

There was a Medical Advisory Board Review dated 10/23/2002 for medical reasons. It listed his driving privilege as suspended since 10/2000 by the Medical Advisory Board. A physician named Chahal reviewed the file and commented that there was a history of subarachnoid hemorrhage. The Medical Advisory Board recommended that Baird was not medically qualified to drive. Attached was a handwritten page which in summary stated that Baird was a 79 year old male with a history of subarachnoid hemorrhage. He received that second degree trauma in 1992. Baird was involved in a collision due to an improper lane change where there was an incident report and request for re-examination submitted. His license was suspended as a result. Baird lacked vision in his left eye since World War 2 and has a moderately severe speech impediment. The notes also mentioned that Baird had sent "bizarre" pictures, newspaper cuttings and cartoons to the Motor Vehicle Administration to show that he was being persecuted by a system he had served as a young man in the Army. Baird also indicated to them that his speech impediment was often dismissed and he was given little credibility. When Baird was interviewed, he initially appeared unintelligible. Once he was able to slow down he could be understood. Baird was given many opportunities to relax and had a friend stay with him. He completed the "Trails A" test but was not able to complete the "Trails B" test after several attempts. The notes continued that he was engageable and with time they felt that he was not psychotic despite the material he sent. The pictures and articles were sent in order to prove that he had worked at United States Army bases and the Pentagon and was not being heard. Baird still remained distracted and would ramble from topic to topic, and would need to be redirected repeatedly. He was oriented and had a reasonable knowledge of current events. Despite that, they still noted that it was clear his distractibility and decreased comprehension would put him at risk for quick processing of input on the road and making quick decisions. In the end, even the friend that was with him agreed that Baird would be a driving risk. There was an Administrative Review and Decision paper attached that appeared to have been signed by Nancy Snowden. The review was for medical reasons, and had no decision selected. In the comments section she wrote that he used rubbing alcohol for pain only and was not on medications. Baird admitted to seizures in the past.

There was a letter from 11/29/2002 which in summary suspended Baird's driving privilege as a result of a medical condition. It required him to attend a certified rehabilitation facility and perform a "behind –the-wheel evaluation". The next group of papers was an MVA Administrative Review & Decision from the Driver Control Division dated 11/29/2002. They found Baird to be not qualified to drive because of physical disability, and continued his suspension. He was eligible to reapply with a rehabilitation evaluation. I was unable to read the signature on the forms and the name was not printed.

There was a suspension notice from 3/10/2004 for failing to attend a driver improvement program as ordered. With that were papers informing Baird of the need to attend a driver improvement program and point system conference sent 1/1/2004 as a result of Baird receiving five or more points within two years.

There was a typed letter with "Yogi" handwritten on the bottom. The letter was a poor copy and difficult to read, but appeared to have been written by Baird and detailing his expenses related to the injury he received, as well as other financial and physical hardships he had faced.

There was a letter from Milton Stroud to Doctor Bauer. The letter had numerous spelling and grammar errors. It described 12/28/1992 when Baird received his head injury. He had several medical tests conducted on him, which found a brain tumor. The tumor could not be operated on because of the bleeding. After seven weeks he was released to Larry Hills care. A few days later, he was found unconscious and returned to Washington Hospital Center. A few weeks after that, he was released to Saint Mary's County social workers and placed in a home in Loveville, which was unsatisfactory. Baird paid two months rent and left after six weeks. Baird had then lost his driver's license because of difficulty hearing, speaking and seeing. Stroud went on to describe how Baird's dentures were broken, his hearing aid was broken and he had a cleft palate. Stroud stated that Baird was staying in his home with him and seems normal in every way. He had known Baird since 1942. The last paragraph was about how the Motor Vehicle Administration obtained a copy of Baird's medical records at his expense, and how Baird could not then get a copy of them from the Motor Vehicle Administration.

There were three pages of photographs and newspaper clippings.

There was a letter with no date from Baird. It described his injury he received to his head on 12/28/1992. He was struck on both sides of his head at the Saint Mary's Shopping Center outside Roy Rodgers Restaurant while employed as a security guard there. There no witnesses to the assault, and Baird had a general idea of who struck him. His glasses and his false teeth were then broken. He was taken to Saint Mary's Hospital in Leonardtown, Maryland, and then to Washington Hospital Center. He remained there from 12/29/1992 to 2/04/1993. He was released but passed out again. He then returned to Washington Hospital Center for observation. He was there two weeks and would not be released, even when requesting to be. He then walked down Branch Avenue to a Union Hall, asking for assistance in returning to Saint Mary's County. Baird was then turned over to the Prince George's County Police, and brought back to the Saint Mary's County Hospital in Leonardtown, Maryland. He was there for two hours before an ambulance came and transported him to Washington Hospital Center at his expense. Baird was then turned over to a social worker, who placed him in a private home in Loveville, Maryland; again at his expense. Baird then left there and two months later was examined by five different physicians. They all found him to be competent. There was a handwritten note that said "crude radiological weapon"

radioactivity wide area" under the typed portion. It was then signed as "Jim Baird", Buhrman-K-Baird" and "Yogi".

There was a handwritten note signed by "Yogi I have no civil rights Buhrman K. Baird". At the top it stated "Pilot Capt Charles Frank Burlingame National Cemetery Army ISN eligible military Pentagon". Underneath that, he wrote about laying the wreath on the Unknown Soldier, and how \$200,000 had been taken from him. He asked where the Veteran's Affairs hospital was located in Loveville. He then discussed the men of the 121st Engineering B Company raising an American flag in honor of the men that lost their lives in Iwo Jima. He ended it with saying that you have to have honor and respect to lay the wreath on the tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

On 5/16/2011, I received the subpoena and response for the text messaging and call log history for 1/19/2011 from 1830 hours until 1930 hours for Verizon Wireless telephone number 240-298-7491. That was the cellular telephone that was personally owned by Wesley Goldston. The Chantilly SMSC32 switch processed a text message 1/19/2011 at 1926 hours that was sent to Goldston's phone from 301-481-3136. There were no calls placed during that date and time range.
